Our junior girls played proud the whole game against a strong Beaverbrook squad. At the final buzzer they lost 54-38 ${\mathfrak B}$








In Mr. Yang's science class they combined the anatomy of the heart with Valentine's Day!!! (Photos courtesy of Ms. Ng)
