




Our staff was treated to some homemade dolma courtesy of Gr. 12 student leader, Ahmed M and his family. It was wonderful!!!














On our Non-Instructional Day, the Multicultural Club treated staff to some wonderful food in celebration of Diwali. The samosas were scrumptious!!!
